Total Visitors Arrivals Fell By 11.6 Percent In December 2016

The Territory drew a total of 285,704 visitors in December 2016, up 11.6 percent from December 2015. December also rounded out twelve months of mixed data regarding visitor arrivals. December 2016 air arrivals were 81,788 a 7.8 percent increase over 75,851 that landed one year earlier. On the other hand, cruise passenger arrivals this month was 203,916 compared to 247,548 last December. The number of cruise ship calls declined to 76 from 83 December last year.

Arrivals by District

Air arrivals to the St. Thomas and St. John district totaled 65,490 a 6.9 percent increase from December 2015 total of 61,265. St. Croix air arrivals posted 11.7 percent growth to reach 16,299 from 14,587 last December. The St. Thomas and St. John district welcomed 189,979 cruise ship passengers, a loss of 18.6 percent from 233,286 last year. There were 13,937 cruise passengers to St. Croix this month compared to 24,221 cruise passengers last December.

Overview Tourism Annual 2016

Territory received 2,573,574 visitors in 2016, compared to the 2,643,021 that came in 2015. For the past three years, seasonal promotions done by the USVI Department of Tourism and its participating partners, assisted in spurring the growth of air visitor arrivals. Air arrivals posted a 4.3 percent growth to 796,889 in 2016 from 764,174 recorded one year earlier. A total of 1,776,685 cruise passengers visited the Territory, a 5.4 percent less than the 1,878,847 cruise passengers who visited last year. There were 569 cruise ship calls during this period or 6.6 percent fewer calls than last year.

Major carrier direct seats experienced growth in all four quarters of 2016, including the returns 2,500,000 of charter international flights from Demark and Minnesota. Moreover, United Airlines added a

The Territory's reported hotel occupancy rate for December was estimated at 61.8 percent compared to 60.0 percent December last year. The hotel occupancy rate for St. Croix was 53.2 percent compared to last December's occupancy rate of 47.6 percent. The occupancy rate for the St. Thomas and St. John district was 64.3 percent compared to 63.7 percent last December.

The average length of stay on St. Thomas and St. John was 6.5 nights and 4.7 nights for St. Croix. Please note the data for hotel occupancy report is missing one large hotel and several small hotels, guesthouses and villas reports were missing or inaccurately reported occupancy data.

Hotel Occupancy



Occupied room nights were 86,766 this month compared to 85,967 in December 2015, an increase of 0.9 percent. A total of \$1,908,982 was collected this December compared to \$1,372,427 in December 2015, a robust gain of 39.1 percent in hotel room revenues.



direct flight seats from Houston, Texas to St. Thomas, US Virgin Island during the summer months of 2016. Major carrier seats direct annual seats were 17,837 compared to 15,198 direct seats in calendar year 2016, an increase of 17.3 percent. Major carrier direct seats are based on daily scheduled flights from main carriers or charter flights that operate outside the Caribbean. Currently, American Airlines, Delta, JetBlue, Spirit, United Airlines, JetAir, Norwegian, and Sun Country are the main or charter carriers that operated within the Territory in 2016.

Quarterly Comparison

The number of total visitors to the Territory for the first quarter of calendar year 2016 grew to 881,835, a 0.8 percent increase from 875,135 visitors for the same quarter in 2015. The second quarter recorded 594,539 visitors versus 605,412 visitors for the corresponding period one year ago. The third quarter of 2016 brought 446,839 visitors, a healthy gain of 14,701 visitors over 2015. The final quarter in 2016 registered 650,361 visitors compared to 730,336 visitors who came to the Territory in 2015, a loss of 11.0 percent.

Arrivals by Air and Cruise

Air arrivals to the Territory in the first quarter of 2016 rose by 1.5 percent to 233,307 from 229,949 in the first quarter 2015. However, air arrivals fell by 2.2 percent in the second quarter of 2016 from 209,469 in 2015 to 204,908. Third and fourth quarter air arrivals also grew, by a strong 12.8 percent and 8.3 percent, respectively.

For the first three months of 2016, cruise passenger arrivals remained at the same level for the corresponding period in 2015. The remaining second, third and fourth quarters fell by 1.6 percent, 1.8 percent, and 16.8 percent, respectively.

Hotel Occupancy

The Territory's hotel annual occupancy rate was 57.1 percent in 2016 from 56.7 percent in 2015. St. Thomas and St. John accommodation establishments placed the annual occupancy rate at 59.9 percent and 61.0 percent in 2015. St. Croix occupancy rate was 46.8 percent compared to 44.5 percent in 2015.

Annual total room nights occupied for 2016 were 987,684, a marginally less that 0.2 percent from the 989,939 occupied room nights in 2015. Available room nights and guest stays average in 2016 were 1,742,988 and 4.7 nights, respectfully. Both were at the same-



level as the year before. There were 4,873 universal visitor accommodation units in 2016.

Hotel Room Revenues

The Tourism Revolving fund is financed by a hotel occupant tax that is levied on all accommodation establishments that engage in short-term room rentals. Hotel Room Revenues collected in calendar year 2016 was \$29,909,549 a strong gain of 19.4 percent from the \$25,058,797 collected in 2015. The growth in hotel room revenues was partly contributed to the increase hotel tax rate from 10 percent to 12.5 percent in January 2016. The hotel room revenues fund promotional and marketing activities used to attract visitors to the Territory. The fund has also been used to subsidize the Virgin Islands Carnival, the Crucian Christmas Carnival, and the St. John 4^{th} of July Festival.

Guest Registrations



Accommodation establishments reported 829,106 guests stayed in the Territory--a 7.9 percent decrease under the 895,466 guests who stayed during the same twelve-month period in 2016. One large hotel and several small guest houses and villas did not report accurately for most of the year, therefore, the Bureau of Economic Research adjusted guest registrations data for 2016 as mentioned earlier, air visitor arrivals grew by 4.3 percent this year. There should be a direct correlation between air visitors' arrivals and guest registrations. Because of this disparity, the bureau cannot state that the guest registrations are entirely accurate. The agency is currently working with these accommodation establishments and in the near future will publish revised hotel occupancy rates and estimated hotel guests by registration. Of the nearly 829,106

guest who stayed in the Territory during 2016, approximately 85.0 percent were from the U.S. mainland. U.S.V.I. residents accounted for another 6.9 percent of guests, followed by residents of neighboring Puerto Rico 2.3 percent.


The New York City sales Region accounts for 28.5 percent of the 205,961 US mainland hotel guests in 2016, followed by Miami sales region by 19.9 percent, Washington D.C. sales region by 14.9 percent, Chicago sales region by 15.8 percent, and lastly, Los Angeles sales region by 17.4 percent. Leading states where guests originate from are New York, New Jersey, Florida, Massachusetts, California, and Pennsylvania. Together these six states produce over one-third of all Virgin Islands guests. Denmark is the leading country originator of foreign visitors to the Territory, with 13,850 guests staying in visitor establishments in 2016. Other leading countries, in rank order include the British Virgin Islands, Canada, Italy, and the United Kingdom.


Air Arrivals 2015-2016

A twobay suite, for example, is reported as one room if it has only one lockable entrance. Similarly, a multi-bay suite could be reported as several units if component parts of it are keyed separately and hence, can be sold separately to unrelated guests. Room is synonymous to unit. Room is generally used in reference to hotels; units are most by associated with condominiums.



Estimated Room Occupancy by Island and Type of Visitor Accommodation



What Is Tourism Sales Region?

Tourism Sales Region is a marketing area of the U.S. designated by the U.S. Virgin Islands Department of Tourism. Chicago represents the states of Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota and Wisconsin. Los Angeles represents the



states of Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington and Wyoming. Miami Represents the States of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, Oklahoma, Tennessee And Texas. New York City represents the states of Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island and Vermont. Washington D.C. represents the states of Delaware, Kentucky, Maryland, North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia, West Virginia and the District of Columbia. San Juan represents the commonwealth of Puerto



Rico.

EXPLANATORY NOTES:

AVERAGE GUEST STAY IN NIGHTS or "average length of stay" is the mean stay in nights of all visiting parties during a given period. Average guest stay equals room nights occupied divided by party arrivals.

HOTELS are the most traditional of visitor accommodations. Guests are provided a full range of services such as food, entertainment and laundry. Large hotels are those maintaining 50 or more units. Small hotels maintain less than 50 units.

OCCUPANCY RATE equals the number of estimated room nights occupied as a percentage of the number of estimated room nights available during a given period.

YEAR-TO-DATE data are tabulated for the period beginning in January of a given year and ending in the listed month of the same year.

ROOM NIGHTS AVAILABLE is the estimated sum, across all rooms for all establishments reporting or not, of the number of nights each room was available for occupancy during a given period.

VISITOR ACCOMMODATION is a business establishment oriented toward serving the needs of transient guests. Visitor accommodations provide lodging and other services to visiting guests on a temporary basis, not more than six months. Accommodations are categorized by large hotel, small hotel, condominium or other.

ROOM NIGHTS OCCUPIED is the estimated sum, across all units for all establishments reporting or not, of the number of nights each unit was occupied during a given period.

CONDOMINIUMS Or "condos" are self-contained apartment-style visitor accommodations. Private kitchens and other such day-to-day living facilities are most often included with the unit. Maid services are generally the only services provided. Condominiums are generally individually-owned but grouped in multi-unit structures. Maintenance and management of condominiums are usually handled by an independent second party



GENERAL:

Data presented in all tables are estimates based on monthly information submitted by individual visitor accommodations. Data represent occupancy status for all U.S. Virgin Islands properties, reporting or not. Reported totals are adjusted within each accommodation category to account for properties that fail to report in any given month. All data are subject to further revision.

Table 4 presents several measures of survey participation for the current month and preceding month, one year prior. The row, "Total Number," is a count of the current inventory of accommodation establishments in the U.S. Virgin Islands and the number of Room Nights Available associated with those establishments during the months listed. "Total Number" includes all accommodations on the islands whether Occupancy Reports were submitted to BER. The rows under, "Percent Submitting," list the distribution of Accommodations and corresponding Room Nights Available according to reporting status for the months listed. "Complete Report" is that share of establishments submitting complete Occupancy Reports to BER with no inconsistencies in the data provided. "Partial Report" is that share submitting a report only partially filled out or containing inconsistent data. "No Report" is the percentage of Accommodations and corresponding Room Nights not reporting to BER in the months listed.

NOTE:

Data are estimates of all territory guests based on Hotel Occupancy Reports submitted to the USVI Bureau of Economic Research. These estimates include actual guest totals submitting reports as well as an estimated component for those properties not reporting. All data subject to revision as new information becomes available.
